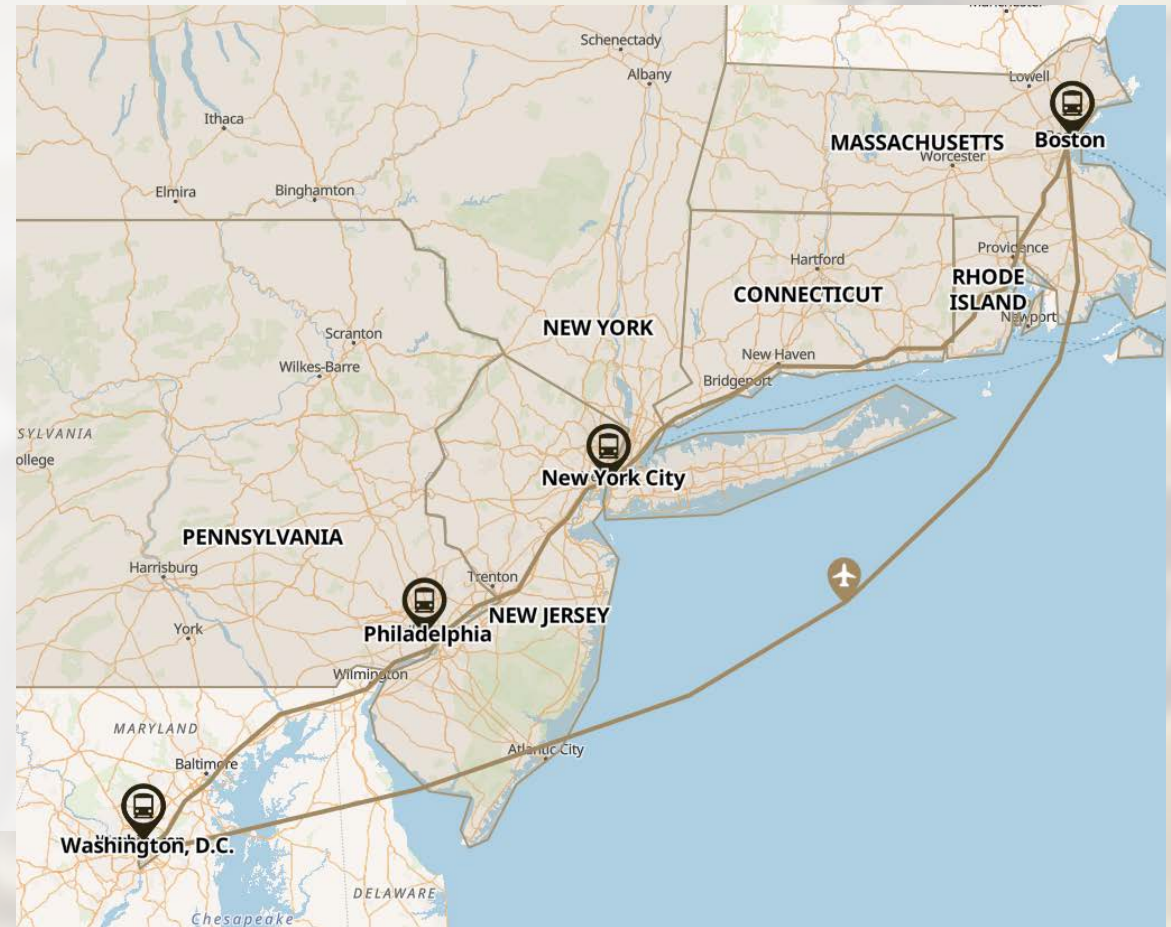

Discover America's Story

Journey beyond the city to Gettysburg and George Washington's Mount Vernon, then continue by rail to Philadelphia, where independence was declared and the Constitution created. Finish back in New York, with time to simply enjoy one of the world's great cities. This is America, told through the places where its story unfolded.

Day 1: Welcome to New York City

Welcome to New York City and the beginning of America's Story. After your arrival in New York, make your way into Manhattan and check into your hotel for the next five nights. It may be late by the time you arrive, so there is nothing planned tonight. Simply settle in, get some rest and prepare to begin exploring tomorrow. If you still have some energy, take a short walk to Times Square for that unforgettable first taste of New York, with its bright lights, giant billboards and unmistakable buzz. Over the coming days, discover a city that has played an extraordinary role in America's story, from generations of immigrants arriving through its harbour to events that have shaped the modern nation.

Day 2: Discover New York City

Ease into New York today aboard a Hop On Hop Off sightseeing bus, ideal to get your bearings while seeing Manhattan's famous neighbourhoods and landmarks. Pass Times Square, the Empire State Building, Fifth Avenue, Wall Street and other sights, hopping off whenever somewhere catches your interest. Use the day to understand how Manhattan fits together and identify other places you may want to revisit. Later, head to Central Park for a change of pace, wandering through the enormous green space that has provided New Yorkers with an escape from the surrounding city since the nineteenth century. This evening, add some classic New York fun with dinner at Ellen's Stardust Diner, famous for its singing waitstaff and Broadway atmosphere, before finishing amongst the bright lights and giant billboards of Times Square. Tomorrow, delve deeper into New York's place in America's Story.

Day 3: Liberty, Immigration & Lower Manhattan

Today explore two enduring symbols of America: the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. Cruise across New York Harbour to Liberty Island, where Lady Liberty has welcomed generations of arrivals since 1886. Continue to Ellis Island and its National Museum of Immigration, where exhibits tell the stories of millions who passed through this gateway hoping to build new lives in America. Allow plenty of time here, as this is far more than another sightseeing stop. Back in Manhattan, continue through Lower Manhattan, walking from Battery Park towards Wall Street and the New York Stock Exchange. Stop at Federal Hall, where George Washington took the oath of office as America's first president in 1789, and see Trinity Church. Today connects the country's founding ideals with generations of people who crossed oceans seeking opportunity and ultimately became part of America's evolving story.

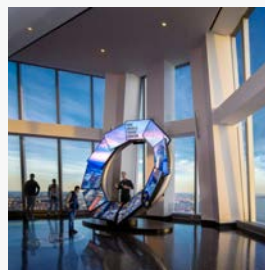

Day 4: 9/11, Remembrance & Resilience

This morning, visit the 9/11 Memorial & Museum, one of New York's most moving experiences and an important chapter in modern American history. Set within the footprint of the former World Trade Centre, the memorial's reflecting pools honour those killed in the attacks of September 11, 2001, while the museum preserves personal stories, artefacts and memories from that day. Afterwards, explore the rebuilt World Trade Centre precinct, including the striking Oculus, before heading to One World Observatory for panoramic views across Manhattan and New York Harbor. Later, walk across the Brooklyn Bridge, an engineering landmark since 1883, and continue into DUMBO for wonderful views back towards the Manhattan skyline. Today moves from tragedy and remembrance to resilience and renewal, revealing how New York responded to one of the defining events of twenty-first-century America and continued to rebuild and look towards the future.

Day 5: Experience Iconic New York

Your last day in New York before heading north to Boston is about enjoying the city beyond its historical landmarks. Begin with one of New York's most iconic experiences, visiting the Empire State Building and taking in the city from above. Continue through Midtown, stepping inside magnificent Grand Central Terminal before browsing Fifth Avenue. Later, head west to explore the Intrepid Museum, housed aboard the legendary aircraft carrier USS Intrepid, and, if time allows, enjoy a Circle Line sightseeing cruise for a different perspective of Manhattan. Towards late afternoon, make your way to St Patrick's Cathedral and Rockefeller Centre, timing your visit to Top of the Rock for sunset, with spectacular views across the Manhattan skyline and some of the best elevated views of Central Park. Tonight, round out your New York adventure with one of the city's great institutions - a Broadway show.

Day 6: New York To Boston

Leave New York behind and travel north by Amtrak to **Boston**, where the next chapter of America's Story begins. The rail journey follows the Northeast Corridor through Connecticut and Rhode Island before arriving in Massachusetts and one of America's most historic cities. After checking into your hotel, spend the afternoon getting acquainted with walkable historic Boston. Wander through **Boston Common**, established in 1634 and recognised as America's oldest public park, before continuing into picturesque **Beacon Hill** with its brick townhouses, gas lamps and cobbled streets. Later, explore the waterfront or head towards **Faneuil Hall** and **Quincy Market** for dinner. Tomorrow the revolutionary story begins in earnest, but this afternoon provides a relaxed introduction to the city where resistance to British rule gathered momentum and events were set in motion that would ultimately lead to the birth of the United States.

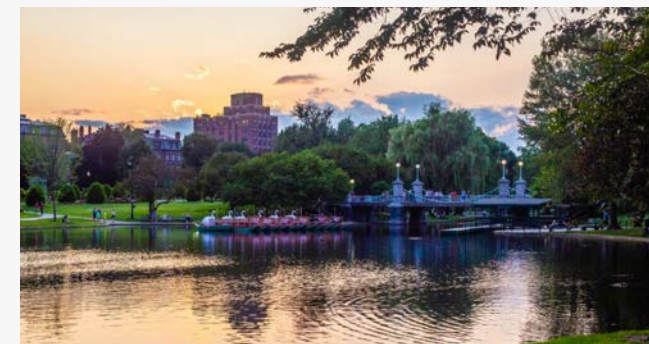

Day 7: Follow Boston's Freedom Trail

Spend today following Boston's **Freedom Trail**, the red-brick route connecting many of the places that shaped the American Revolution. Begin with a guided walking tour bringing the stories, personalities and conflicts of colonial Boston to life. Pass Boston Common, Massachusetts State House, Granary Burying Ground, Old South Meeting House, Old State House and the site of the Boston Massacre, before continuing towards Faneuil Hall, Paul Revere House and Old North Church. After your tour, continue along the Freedom Trail through the North End and across to Charlestown to visit the legendary USS Constitution, America's oldest commissioned naval vessel launched in 1797. Later, head to the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum to relive one of the defining acts of colonial resistance. Today brings you remarkably close to the people, places and events that ultimately led to the birth of the United States.

Day 8: Lexington & Concord

Travel beyond Boston today to **Lexington** and **Concord**, where the American Revolution moved from resistance to armed conflict. Join an organised sightseeing tour through the Massachusetts countryside, following the route associated with Paul Revere's midnight ride and the events of April 19, 1775. Visit **Lexington Battle Green**, where the first shots were fired between colonial militia and British troops, before continuing to **Concord** and the **Old North Bridge**, scene of the "shot heard round the world." Along the way, hear how farmers, tradesmen and townspeople became participants in a struggle that would create a new nation. Depending on the tour, stops may also include homes and other Revolutionary War sites. Returning to Boston later today, you will have followed the story from protest and rebellion to the opening battles of a war for independence, setting the scene for Philadelphia ahead.

Day 9: Boston To Washington, D.C.

Say goodbye to Boston today and fly south to **Washington, D.C.**, the nation's capital whose beginnings you have just explored in Massachusetts. After checking into your hotel, keep the remainder of the day relaxed. Take a walk downtown for your first taste of the capital, heading towards the **White House** before continuing to the **National Mall** and the impressive **Washington Monument**. Alternatively, explore the neighbourhood, enjoy the restaurants around Penn Quarter or simply settle in before the sightseeing days ahead. Washington feels different from New York and Boston, with broad avenues, monumental architecture and national institutions dominating the landscape. Over the next four days, America's Story expands from revolution and independence into war, civil rights, innovation and remembrance, while introducing some of the people who shaped the country. This afternoon provides an easy introduction to the city at the centre of it all.

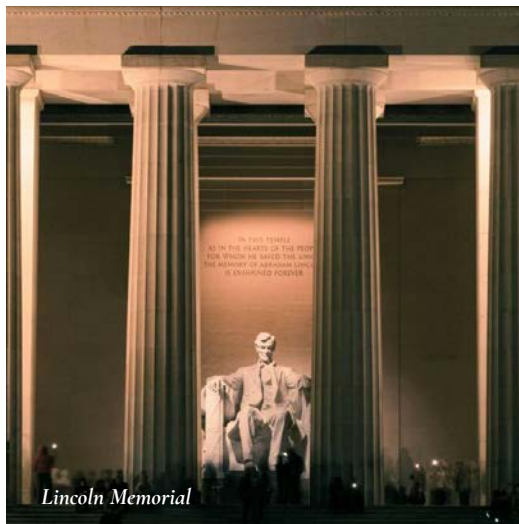

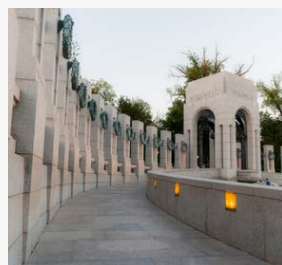

Day 10: Monuments, Memorials & Arlington Cemetery

Explore the iconic institutions, monuments and memorials of the American capital today, using your Hop On Hop Off Trolley to travel between the highlights. Begin around Capitol Hill, seeing the United States Capitol before continuing to the National Archives, home to the Declaration of Independence, Constitution and Bill of Rights. Continue along the National Mall to the Lincoln Memorial and nearby Vietnam Veterans, Korean War Veterans Memorials, and World War II Memorial before visiting the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial, Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial and Jefferson Memorial situated around the Tidal Basin. Later, cross the Potomac River to Arlington National Cemetery, where highlights include President John F. Kennedy's gravesite and Eternal Flame, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier with its famous Changing of the Guard ceremony. Together, these landmarks reveal the people, conflicts, ideals and sacrifices that have shaped America and continue to influence it today.

Day 11: Discover The Smithsonian

Set today aside to explore the extraordinary Smithsonian Institution, with more than 20 museums covering everything from American history and culture to art, aviation, science and space. We suggest starting at the National Museum of American History, before exploring the powerful National Museum of African American History and Culture, tracing stories from slavery and emancipation through segregation and the Civil Rights Movement to the present day. If time allows, add the National Air and Space Museum, with its incredible collection celebrating aviation, space exploration and the Space Race. With so much to choose from, seeing everything simply isn't possible, so concentrate on the collections that interest you most. Travel USA can help navigate the many Smithsonian options and suggest museums best suited to your interests, ensuring you make the most of your day exploring this remarkable collection of national museums.

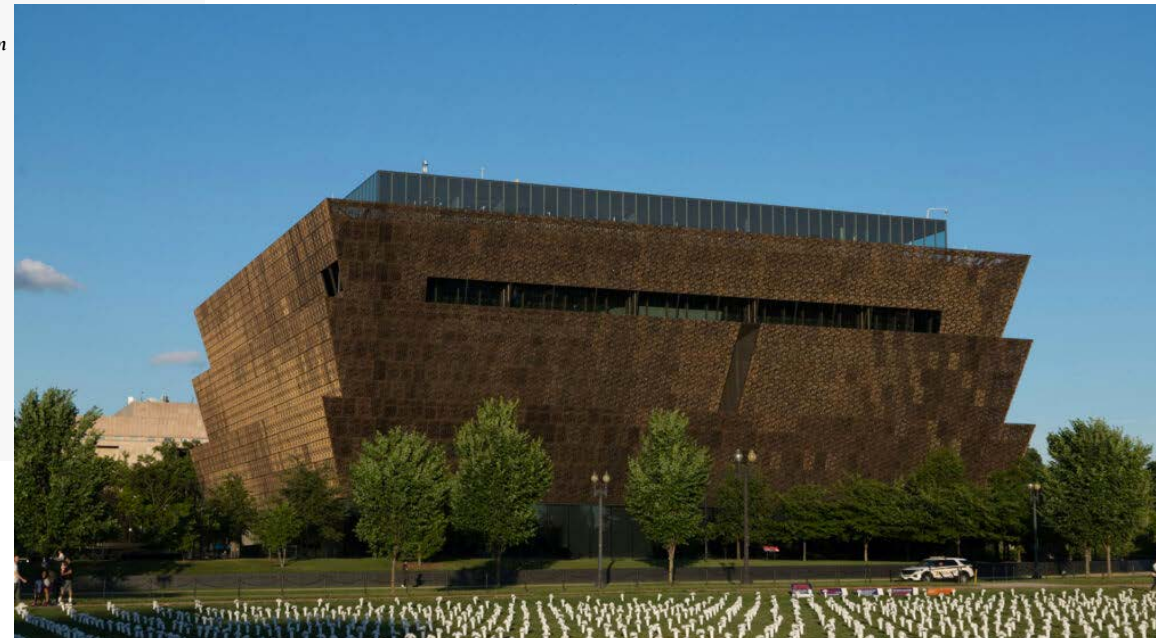

Day 12: Gettysburg & The Civil War

Leave Washington behind for the day and travel north to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, site of the consequential 1863 Civil War battle of the Civil War. Join a full day tour to explore Gettysburg National Military Park, where Union and Confederate armies fought for three days and more than 50,000 soldiers were killed, wounded, captured or missing. Begin at the Visitor Centre and museum before touring key areas of the battlefield, where interpretation helps make sense of the scale, strategy and cost of the conflict. Visit Gettysburg National Cemetery, where President Abraham Lincoln delivered his Gettysburg Address and reframed the war as a struggle for the nation's promise of equality. Returning to Washington this evening, today provides a chapter in America's Story: a nation divided against itself, the price paid to preserve the Union, and the unfinished struggle over freedom and equality.

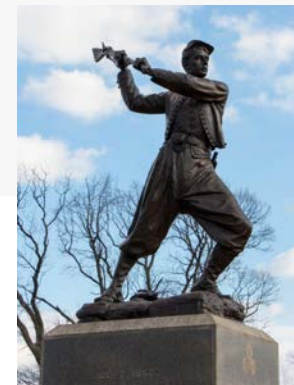

Day 13: Mount Vernon & Old Town Alexandria

Today, cross the Potomac into Virginia and step into the world of **George Washington** as a revolutionary leader, president and plantation owner on an organised sightseeing tour to **Mount Vernon** and **Old Town Alexandria**. Explore Washington's estate overlooking the Potomac River, touring the mansion and grounds, visiting his tomb and learning about his leadership, presidency and plantation life. Importantly, Mount Vernon also tells the stories of the enslaved men, women and children whose labour sustained the estate, adding another perspective to the ideals of liberty associated with the new nation. Your tour also explores **Old Town Alexandria**, with its cobbled streets, colonial architecture and connections to Washington and early America. This evening, consider returning to the **National Mall** to see the monuments illuminated after dark. The **Lincoln Memorial** in particular is impressive at night, providing a memorable finale to your time in the capital

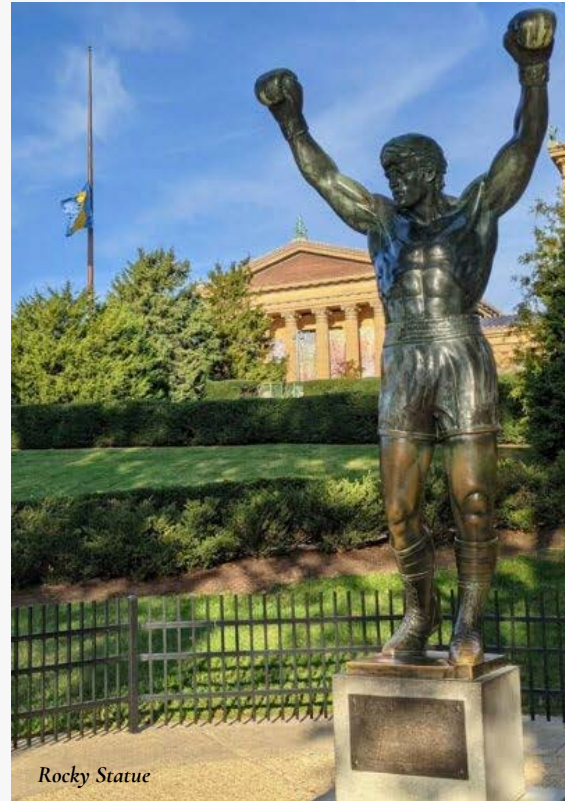
Day 14: Washington D.C. to Philadelphia

Board Amtrak today for the journey from Washington, D.C. to Philadelphia, where the next chapter of America's Story awaits. After checking into your hotel near Rittenhouse Square, spend the afternoon discovering another side of the city. Wander through Rittenhouse Square before heading along the Benjamin Franklin Parkway towards the Philadelphia Museum of Art. See the famous Rocky Statue before climbing the equally famous Rocky Steps, recreating one of cinema's most recognisable moments and enjoying views back towards the Philadelphia skyline. Afterwards, make your way back towards Rittenhouse Square, perhaps stopping for a drink or exploring some of the surrounding streets and shops. Tonight, enjoy dinner at one of the many restaurants nearby and perhaps sample a famous Philadelphia cheesesteak. Tomorrow is devoted to the city's extraordinary historic heart and the places where the United States was born.

Day 15: The Birthplace Of America

Devote today to Philadelphia's extraordinary role in the birth of the United States. Begin at Independence Hall, where delegates debated and approved the Declaration of Independence in 1776 and later framed the Constitution. See the Liberty Bell, President's House Site and National Constitution Centre before visiting the Museum of the American Revolution, whose artefacts and stories trace the struggle from colonial unrest through war and independence. Afterwards, continue through Old City, seeking out Franklin Court and sites associated with Benjamin Franklin, visiting Christ Church or wandering along Elfreth's Alley. Stop at Reading Terminal Market for lunch or a taste of Philadelphia's famous food scene. After following the road to revolution through Boston, Lexington and Concord, today brings many threads together. Few places could be more appropriate for America's Story: this is where revolutionary ideas were transformed into a declaration, constitution and country.

Tonight, enjoy dinner somewhere that takes your fancy or head back amongst the lights, billboards and crowds of Times Square, or venture up to the Edge Observation Deck for more amazing views over New York city at sunset. 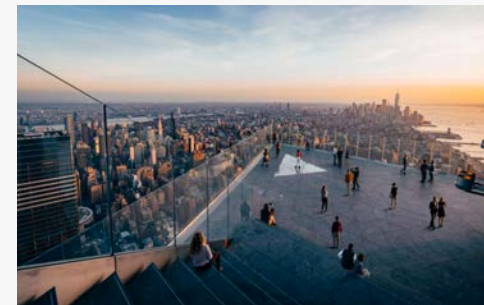

Day 17: Central Park & A Final Night in New York
