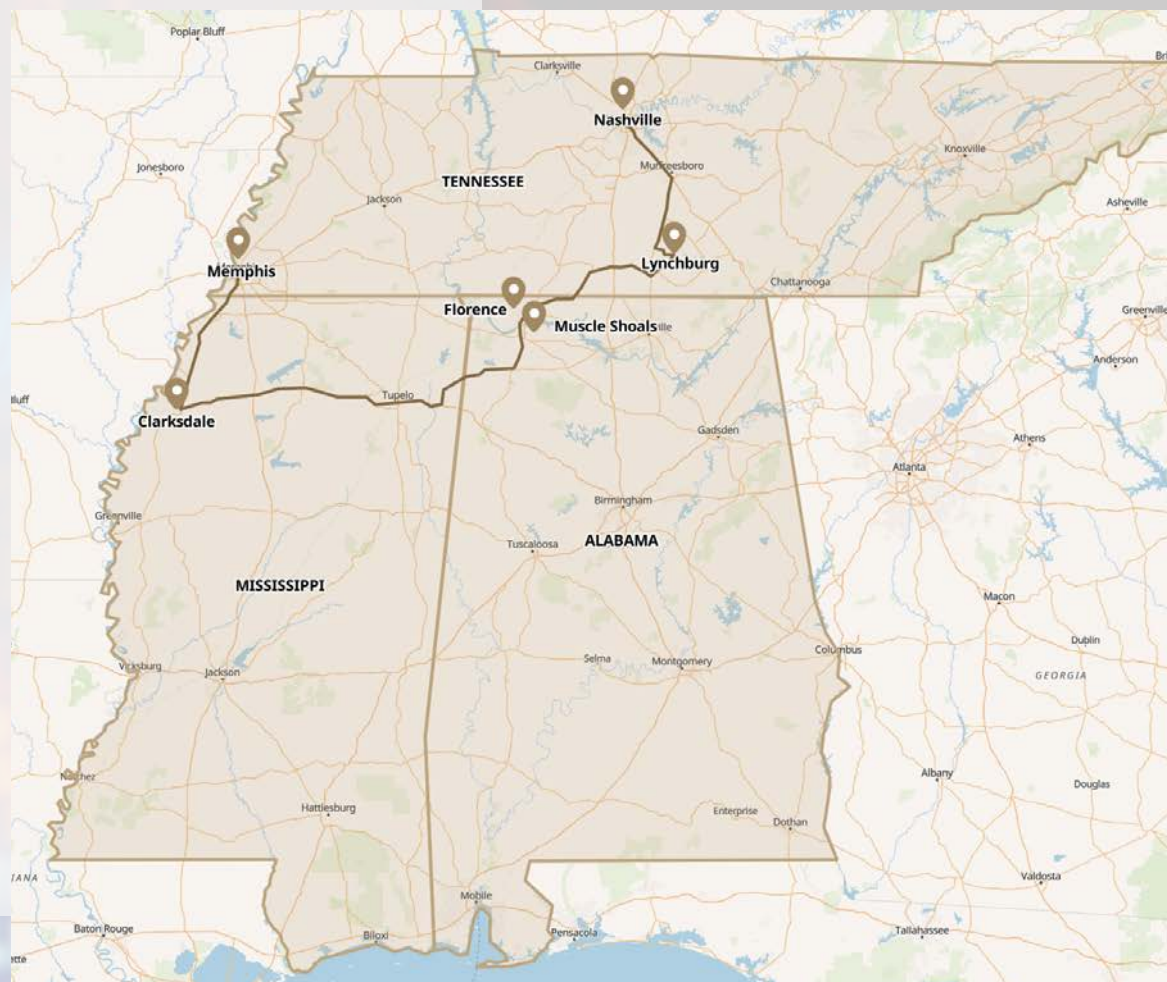

Soundtracks of the South

Follow the rhythm of America's musical heartland on this Southern journey through Nashville, Muscle Shoals, Clarksdale and Memphis, featuring a collection of carefully selected included experiences along the way. Designed for Kiwi travellers with a love of music, storytelling and authentic regional culture, this itinerary traces the evolution of American sound - from country songwriting rooms and legendary recording studios to the birthplace of the blues and the home of rock'n'roll. Begin in Nashville, where honky-tonk energy and songwriting heritage define the city's creative pulse. Travel south along scenic backroads and sections of the Natchez Trace Parkway, pausing in Lynchburg for a classic Tennessee whiskey experience, before reaching Muscle Shoals, where soul music history was written inside modest studios on the Tennessee River. Continue into the Mississippi Delta, stopping in Clarksdale for raw blues culture and juke joint atmosphere, before finishing in Memphis, where Sun Studio, Beale Street and Graceland bring the city's iconic musical legacy to life. This is the Deep South, told through music, landscape and lived history.

Nashville

Day 1: Arrival - First Notes of Music City

Fly from New Zealand to Nashville with our Star Alliance partners, Air New Zealand and United Airlines, on convenient one-stop connections. Arrive in Nashville and transfer to your centrally located accommodation. After a long-haul journey, today is designed as a gentle introduction rather than a full sightseeing day, allowing time to rest and adjust to the rhythm of the American South. Depending on arrival time, enjoy a relaxed walk along the Cumberland River or through downtown, where historic architecture sits alongside modern music venues and rooftop bars. As evening approaches, take your first taste of Music City on Broadway, where live music flows from every doorway and neon lights set the atmosphere. Enjoy dinner at a local favourite such as Acme Feed & Seed or Skull's Rainbow Room before easing into iconic venues like Tootsie's Orchid Lounge, Robert's Western World and The Stage for an introduction to Nashville's legendary live music scene.

Day 2: Nashville - City Orientation & Country Music Core

Begin the day with the Nashville Hop-On Hop-Off Trolley, the best way to understand the city's layout and key districts without rushing. The route connects major highlights including Marathon Motor Works, Centennial Park and its Parthenon replica, The Gulch, and the Musicians Hall of Fame & Museum, before arriving in the Country Music Hall of Fame precinct. Your included experience brings together admission to the Country Music Hall of Fame & Museum and a guided 1-hour tour of RCA Studio B, offering a powerful introduction to Nashville's recording history. Continue to the nearby Ryman Auditorium, the legendary "Mother Church of Country Music," for a self-guided visit that connects the city's performance and recording legacy. As night falls, step into Nashville's live music culture in a more intentional way, exploring a couple of handpicked venues featuring emerging songwriters and traditional country performers for a deeper introduction to the city's sound.

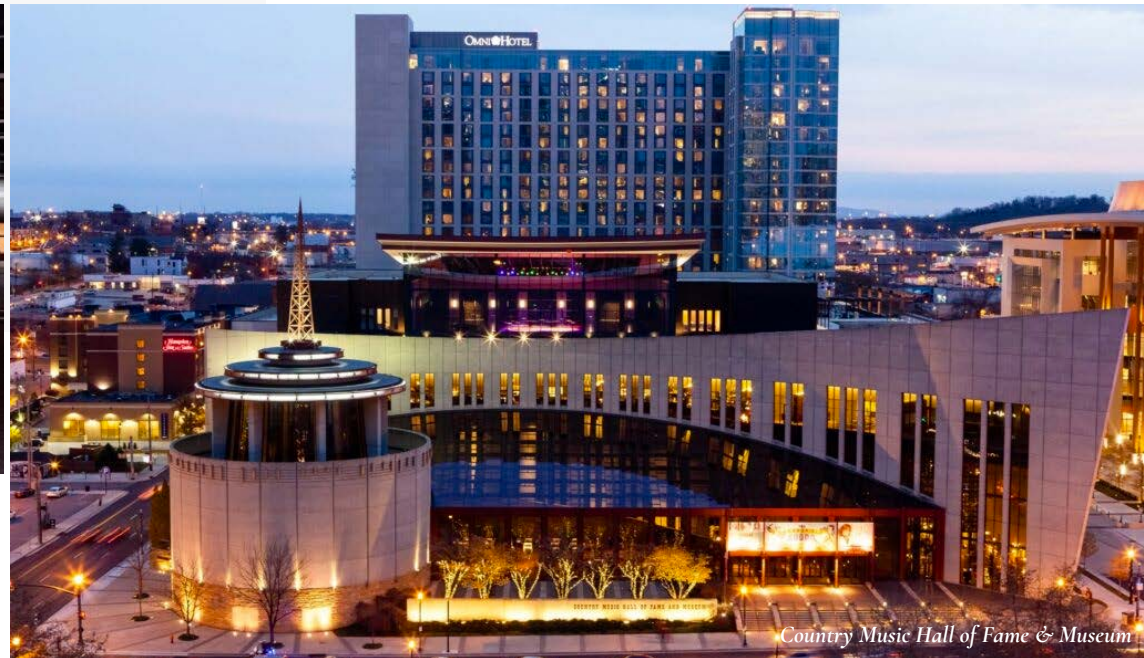

Day 3: Nashville - Flavours of the South & Grand Ole Opry Night

This morning, enjoy a Guided Food Tour in the 12South neighbourhood, one of Nashville's most stylish and walkable districts. The experience includes five or more tastings such as breakfast tacos, seasonal donuts, brisket quesadillas, Southern hot pork and grits, and a signature secret dish, combining into a relaxed lunch replacement while showcasing Nashville's modern Southern food culture. The afternoon is kept intentionally light, allowing time to unwind or explore at your own pace. You may choose to revisit Centennial Park and its impressive Parthenon replica or alternatively visit the historic Belle Meade Estate for a glimpse into Tennessee's plantation heritage and equestrian history. Early evening is reserved for rest before tonight's highlight - the legendary Grand Ole Opry. Experience a world-class multi-artist live show at the heart of country music history, followed by an included backstage tour offering exclusive insight into one of the most iconic stages in American music.

Day 4: Nashville - Your Day, Your Way

Your final full day in Nashville is designed to give you complete flexibility to explore the city in a way that suits your interests and pace. Music-focused travellers may explore Music Row, the creative heart of the city, along with museums such as the Johnny Cash Museum, the Musicians Hall of Fame & Museum, or the National Museum of African American Music, each offering a different perspective on Nashville's musical story. For those interested in culture, the Frist Art Museum or Tennessee State Museum provide a broader look at art and heritage. Alternatively, enjoy Nashville's neighbourhoods, from boutique shopping and cafés in The Gulch to the murals and relaxed atmosphere of 12South. This evening, choose your final experience: the Listening Room Café (songwriter performances in an intimate setting), the Bluebird Café (legendary acoustic venue where artists like Taylor Swift were discovered), or a return to Broadway for a final taste of live music energy.

Day 5: Nashville to Florence (Muscle Shoals) via Natchez Trace, Lynchburg & Jack Daniel's Distillery (400 km)

Collect your rental car this morning and depart Nashville, following a scenic stretch of the Natchez Trace Parkway. This historic route is one of America's most scenic drives, winding through forested landscapes, rolling hills and quiet countryside, and offering a relaxed, immersive start to the journey. Continue along the Parkway before joining, connecting rural roads toward Lynchburg. Arrive in Lynchburg, home of the legendary Jack Daniel's Distillery, where you'll enjoy a guided tour and tasting exploring the heritage of one of the world's most iconic whiskey producers. Continue your journey west and south into northern Alabama, travelling through peaceful countryside toward the Tennessee River region. Arrive in Florence, part of the Muscle Shoals area, in the late afternoon. This riverside region is renowned for its influential recording studios that helped shape soul, rock and R&B. Settle in and enjoy a relaxed evening along the Tennessee River, taking in the slower pace and small-town atmosphere of the Shoals.

Day 6: Muscle Shoals - Soul, Studios & Southern Heritage

Spend the day exploring the musical heritage of Muscle Shoals, one of the most influential recording destinations in the world. Begin at FAME Recording Studios (approx. US\$20), where countless soul and rock classics were recorded, followed by Muscle Shoals Sound Studio (approx. US\$25), home to artists such as The Rolling Stones, Aretha Franklin and Paul Simon. Continue to Ivy Green (house & museum tour approx. US\$25), the childhood home of Helen Keller, offering a powerful cultural contrast to the region's music legacy. Discover how this small Alabama area helped define global music history while also producing remarkable stories of resilience and achievement. This region offers a quieter, more reflective contrast to Nashville, defined by modest studios, river landscapes and enduring creative legacy. The evening is relaxed, offering a welcome pause after Nashville's energy before continuing deeper into the Mississippi Delta and Memphis music story.

Day 7: Florence (Muscle Shoals) to Clarksdale - Into the Delta (280 km)

Depart Muscle Shoals and travel west into Mississippi, joining sections of the historic Blues Highway (U.S. Route 61), part of the wider Mississippi Blues Trail network of heritage routes and markers across the Delta. This road is deeply embedded in American music history and famously referenced by artists such as Bob Dylan as the symbolic highway of the blues. Arrive in Clarksdale this afternoon, widely regarded as one of the spiritual homes of the blues. Visit the Delta Blues Museum (approx. US\$15) and visit the legendary Crossroads (Highway 61 and 49 intersection) before enjoying live music in an authentic juke joint setting.

Day 8: Clarksdale to Memphis - Blues to Rock 'n' Roll (180 km)

Enjoy a relaxed morning in Clarksdale before driving north through the Mississippi Delta along further stretches of U.S. Route 61, following the Mississippi Blues Trail heritage route - marked by historic towns and musical landmarks. The drive traces the evolution of the blues, from its raw Delta origins to the electrified sound that defined modern rock'n'roll in the city ahead. Arrive in Memphis by late afternoon, return your rental vehicle and settle into your centrally located accommodation. Begin your Memphis experience with a stroll along Beale Street, where live blues, neon lights and street performers bring the Delta story to its Memphis finale.

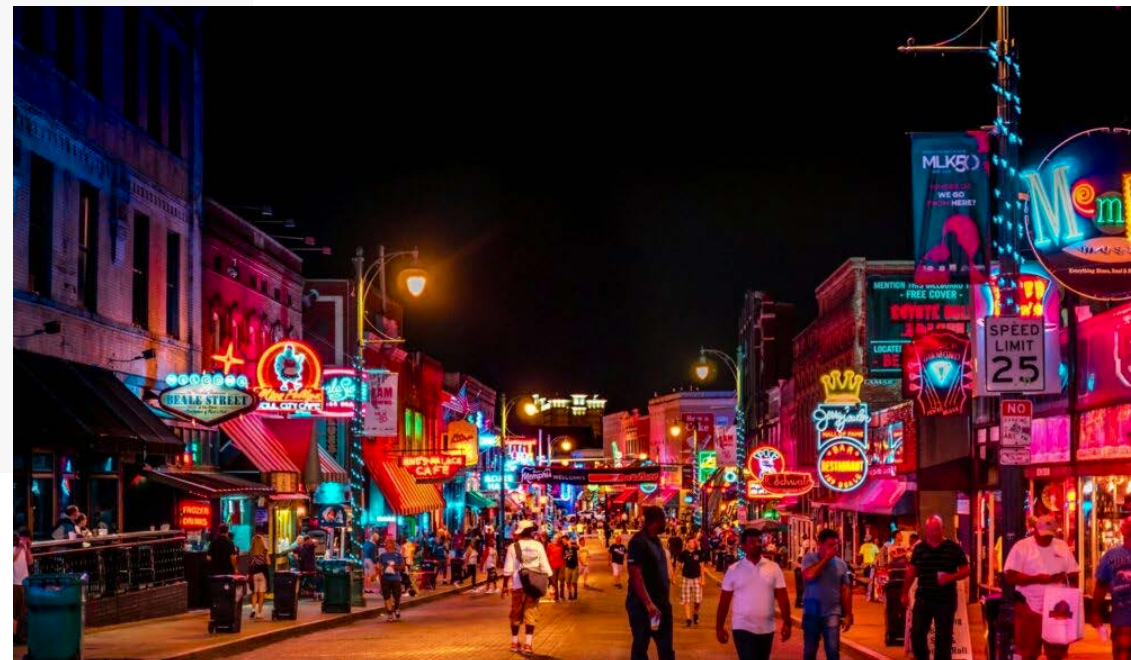

Day 9: Memphis - Sun Studio, Blues Heritage & Mississippi River BBQ Dinner & Music Cruise

Begin the day with a guided Memphis city tour, bringing together the city's riverfront, music districts and cultural foundations. Included is a visit to Sun Studio, one of the birthplaces of rock 'n' roll, where Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash and Jerry Lee Lewis recorded their earliest hits. Continue through downtown Memphis, passing Beale Street and key historic districts that define the city's identity. This afternoon is free, with options including the Blues Hall of Fame, the South Main Arts District, or simply relaxing along the Mississippi riverfront and Tom Lee Park. This gives time to slow the pace after the morning touring and absorb the city's atmosphere. This evening, board a Mississippi River BBQ Dinner & Music Cruise featuring live blues and jazz, paired with classic Southern BBQ, as you experience Memphis from the water. After returning to shore, those wanting more atmosphere may enjoy a stroll along Beale Street's neon-lit live music venues.

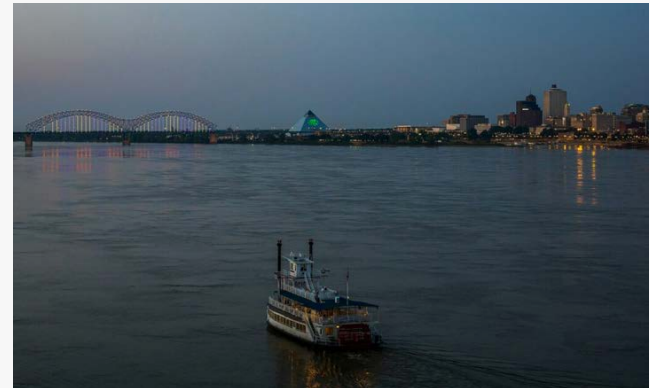

Day 10: Memphis - Graceland, Civil Rights & Stax Soul Legacy

Begin the day with an Ultimate VIP Elvis Experience at Graceland, including a guided mansion tour with expert commentary, Elvis's artifact show and tell, access to the private VIP exhibit, exclusive photo opportunity, commemorative VIP badge, entry to the EPM Entertainment Complex, and access to Elvis' custom jets. Your tour also includes a meal voucher for a light lunch on-site before returning to downtown Memphis. Continue to the powerful National Civil Rights Museum, located at the Lorraine Motel, where Dr Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated in 1968, offering one of the most significant cultural and historical experiences in the United States. In the afternoon, visit the Stax Museum of American Soul Music, completing the city's musical story from blues to soul and rock evolution. This evening is at leisure, with the option to experience iconic Memphis BBQ at Central BBQ or return to Beale Street for live blues and neon-lit atmosphere.

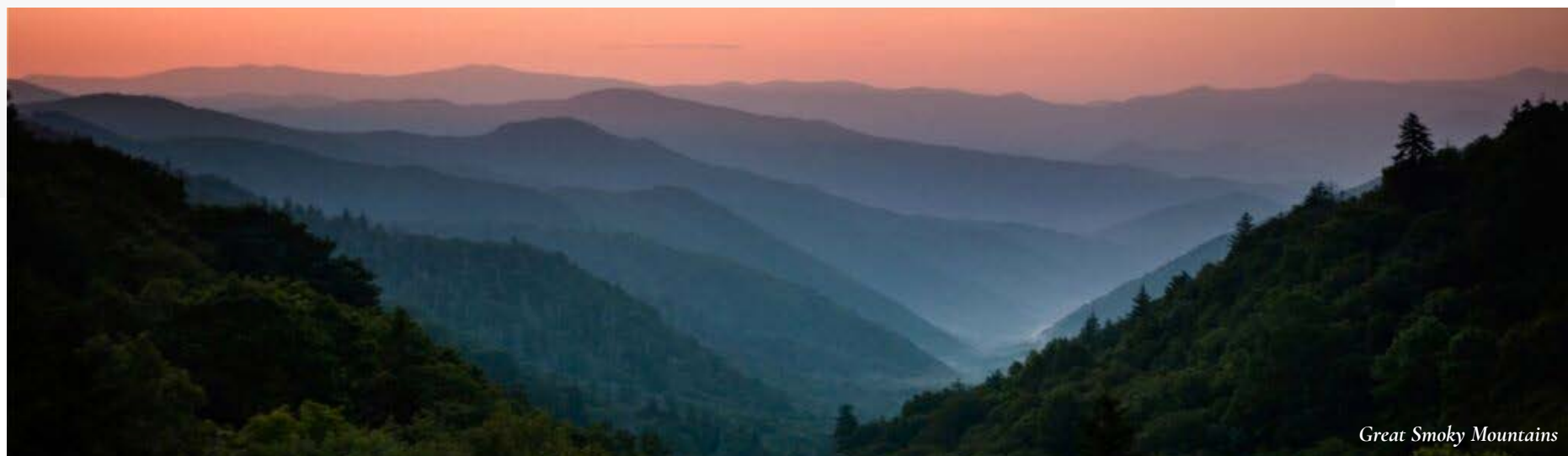

Day 11: Departure from Memphis

Enjoy a relaxed final morning in Memphis. Depending on flight timing, take a walk along the Mississippi riverfront, enjoy a final coffee downtown, or revisit Beale Street for a last glimpse of the city's musical energy. When ready, transfer to Memphis International Airport for your onward journey home, travelling with Star Alliance partners Air New Zealand and United Airlines via major U.S. gateway hubs such as Houston, San Francisco or Los Angeles, with onward connections back to New Zealand. Alternatively, if you prefer to extend your adventure, collect your rental car and continue exploring deeper into Tennessee, with easy access to destinations such as **Chattanooga** or the **Great Smoky Mountains** region, including Knoxville, Gatlinburg, Pigeon Forge and Sevierville. Your journey concludes after tracing the musical heartbeat of the American South - from Nashville's songwriting rooms to Muscle Shoals' studios, the raw blues of Clarksdale, and Memphis' defining role in rock'n'roll and soul history.
